- Blood in stool
- A change in bowel habits
- Diarrhea, constipation, vomiting
- Unexplained weight loss
- Persistent fatigue
- Gas, bloating, fullness, cramps

The **#1 symptom** of colorectal cancer
is **no symptom at all.**

Colorectal Cancer:

- Is the #2 cause of cancer death in the U.S., and will kill as many people this year as breast cancer and AIDS combined.
- It affects men and women equally.
- 75% of people diagnosed have no family history.
- It mostly affects people over 50, but can occur at any age.
- Colorectal cancer is 90% preventable when detected early. Colonoscopies remove polyps before they become cancer.
